"What's New in Fluid Resuscitation for Hemorrhagic Shock...is Old"

Objectives:

- Review the five hemorrhage resuscitation goals.
- Identify the physiologic shortfalls of resuscitating bleeding patients with the Massive Transfusion Protocol (MTP).
