- Define and differentiate submassive PE from other types of pulmonary embolisms, emphasizing key diagnostic criteria and clinical presentations.
- Discuss the various imaging modalities and diagnostic tests used for the identification of submassive PE and outline their respective advantages and limitations.
- Describe the current evidence-based management strategies for submassive PE, including anticoagulation, systemic thrombolysis, catheter-directed thrombolysis, and surgical embolectomy.
- Provide an overview of ECMO cannulation as a potential rescue therapy for patients with submassive PE, including indications, contraindications, and procedural aspects.
- Evaluate the roles of different healthcare professionals within a multidisciplinary team and discuss best practices for effective communication and coordination in the management of submassive PE.
- Analyze case studies to apply the concepts and management strategies discussed in the lecture to real-world clinical scenarios.
