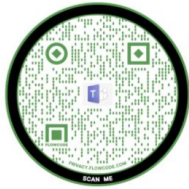

- Review important court cases involving end of life medical ethics.
- Define the terminology used in the Texas Advance Directive Act.
- Discuss the concept of futility in end-of-life decision making.
